Structure, governance and management

Type of governing document

The Forum is a charitable unincorporated association and the purposes and administration arrangements are set out in our constitution. The constitution was most recently altered on 8 June 2007 and recognition as a Scottish Charity was gained on 20 September 2007.

Trustee recruitment and appointment

The Forum's Trustees (Committee) are appointed or reappointed by the members at our annual general meeting. The Committee has the power to co-opt up to two members of the Forum to the Committee.

Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

Our purposes, as recorded in our constitution, are to advance education through the promotion of a clear understanding in Scotland, Russia, and the countries of the Former Soviet Union, of the respective ways of life, history, heritage and the cultural and commercial activities and voluntary services of the said countries and through the creation of educational and cultural contacts of all kinds between the peoples of these countries.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

The Forum arranges a programme of lectures and exhibitions each year, publishes 'The SRF Review' twice a year, circulates a fortnightly information bulletin by e-mail and provides information through its website. The Forum rented premises to house a Russian cultural centre, the Scotland-Russia Institute, with rental and associated costs met for the first three years by a donation from Scottish and Newcastle plc, in June 2008. As well as meetings of the Forum, the centre hosts art exhibitions featuring works from or about Russia and the other countries of the Former Soviet Union, language classes and a library.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

The impetus given to the Forum's activities by the opening of its Scotland-Russia Institute in September 2008 was maintained, with membership increasing by 17% and attendance at events increasing threefold. The year's programme included talks as diverse as 'The icon and the book: a brief survey of spirituality in Russia' and 'Painting the dream: the world of Socialist Realist painting'. A successful conference on 'Business in Russia' was held, and exhibitions ranged from historic photographs to contemporary works of art. A donation from the St Andrew Society of Moscow allowed the Russian play 'Bloody Mary' to be performed in Cambridge and London, following its earlier successful production by the Forum in Edinburgh. The library now lists over 1000 books in its online catalogue, and usage continues to grow. Classes in the Russian language for various levels of ability have proved popular. Through the good offices of the Forum, three Language Assistants have been placed in Russian Universities and institutions of Higher Education. The Forum was active in supporting the teaching of Russian in schools and is campaigning against the decision of the Scottish Qualifications Authority to abandon National Courses in Russian in 2015.

Two issues of the Scotland-Russia Forum *Review* were published during the year and circulated to nearly 400 people and institutions. The weekly e-mail bulletin was circulated to around 1000 members and non-members with information on events and activities relevant to the Forum's objects.

The Forum's website continued to be extended and improved and is being developed as the primary source of information about the Forum and its activities.

Financial review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

As a result of the surplus of £9831 in unrestricted funds for the year, the Forum held unrestricted funds of £19870 at the year end which will support the Forum's general activities in the coming year. A total surplus of £8116 in restricted funds will allow the Forum to meet its commitment to funders to operate a cultural centre in Edinburgh for a minimum of three years to June 2011. In order to maintain reserves, and to continue to operate the cultural centre until the expiry of the present lease in June 2013, it was thought prudent to introduce a modest increase in subscriptions (the first since 2003) from September 2011.
